This specification is one of two which follow the GCSE Home Economics criteria. The other is GCSE Home Economics: Child Development.

- First examination is in June 2010.
- First certification is in June 2011.
- There is one tier of assessment with a single paper which covers all of the grades A*–G.

Written Paper (Unit 1)

100 marks
40% of the total marks

6–8 compulsory questions with a combination of short answer, structured and free response questions. Some questions will include stimulus material.

Food and Nutrition in Practice (Unit 2) Controlled Assessment

160 marks across the two tasks.
60% of the total marks: 45% Individual Investigation; 15% Research Task.

Students must complete an Individual Investigation worth 120 marks and a Research Task worth 40 marks.

The controlled assessment tasks must be completed under supervision within the classroom. The Individual Investigation should occupy approximately 18 hours of supervision, and the Research Task approximately 6–8 hours of supervision.
